Monday	<p>Starter: Using the letters of your full name, how many other words can you create?</p> <p>Learning Intention: I can practice spelling words I need to know.</p> <p>Activity:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Copy each word out 3 times. ➤ Write a sentence for each word. ➤ Pick an activity from the Spelling Activities Grid.
Tuesday	<p>Learning Intention: I can explain and use alliteration.</p> <p>Activity: Alliteration is when we use different words starting with the same letter in a sentence or text. It can be used for humour or expression. For example, 'Busy buzzing, the bee behaved beautifully.' Alliteration can make your words more engaging - and entertaining. And, when your writing engages your audience, they are more likely to pay attention and remember what you say.</p> <p>Alliteration can be used in tongue twisters. For example:</p> <p>Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers A peck of pickled peppers Peter Piper picked If Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers Where's the peck of pickled peppers Peter Piper picked?</p> <p>Your task is to use alliteration to create your own tongue twister!</p> <p>Extension: Have a look in a book you have at home or have been reading, can you find any alliteration in the text?</p>

<p>Wednesday</p>	<p>Learning Intention: I can re write a well-known Fairy-tale with an alternative ending.</p> <p>Activity: Choose your favourite Fairy-tale! Have a go at rewriting the story! I would like you to give the story a different ending! Think about the morale of the story, how could you change it? What might the characters do to change the story?</p> <p>How might you be successful in this task?</p> <p>Success Criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Used interesting vocabulary. • Used correct punctuation. • Check over your work. • Spell most words correctly. <p>Can you think of more success criteria?</p>
<p>Thursday</p>	<p>Learning Intention: I can redesign the cover of a book I have read at home.</p> <p>Activity: Using a book you have at home, design a new front cover for the book. Does the cover art reflect the content and mood of the book?</p> <p>Your book cover should have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A clear title and author name. • An illustration that shows a bit about the book. • A summary of the plot without giving away the ending. • A review (opinion) about the book. <p>Use the descriptions in the book to help with any character or setting drawings!</p>
