Challenge

Temperature is the measure of warmth - How hot or cold something is. Temperature is measured using a device called a thermometer. A thermometer is a long thin tube that is filled with liquid mercury. The mercury will rise when the temperature is hot, and fall when the temperature is cold.

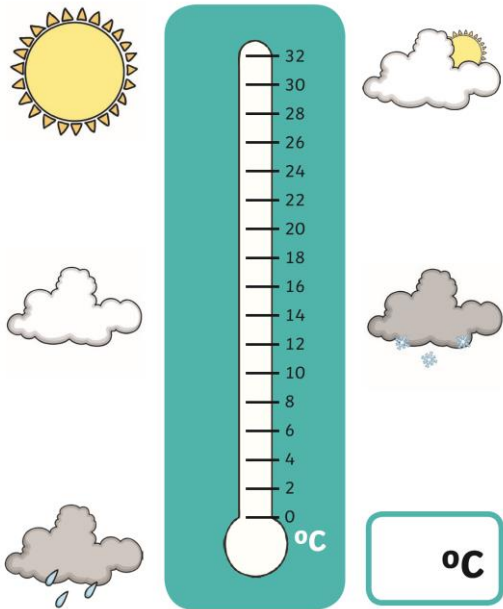
How Is Temperature Measured?

Temperature is measured with three different scales, but we will focus in:

- Celsius: The most common form of measuring temperature in day-to-day situations.

With the help of an adult, using an outdoor thermometer or searching on Google can you check the temperature in Celsius?


Today's Temperature

Remember **The rule of commutativity**

- When writing a multiplication, the numbers being multiplied can be written in any order. So if a child knows that $3 \times 4 = 12$, they also know that $4 \times 3 = 12$.
